
On the 26th of May 2020, ECA hosted its first webminar on the topic of the responses to Covid-19 pandemic situation from ECA agencies.

THE-ICE announces Virtual International Panel of Experts (VIPoE)

THE-ICE's annual signature event, the International Panel of Experts Forum, offers highlevel panel sessions, workshops, and roundtable discussions focusing on strategic issues facing tourism, hospitality, events, and culinary arts (TH&E) education, bridging research, education, and industry.

This year, in light of the COVID-19 crisis and global travel restrictions, THE-ICE has made the difficult decision to postpone THE-ICE 14th IPoE Forum.

The postponed event, proudly hosted by the University of Derby, United Kingdom, exploring the theme "Securing our Future-Exploring Sustainability in and of Tourism and Hospitality Education", will now take place during the week of 25th October 2021.

As a consequence, this year, from 26-29 October 2020, THE-ICE will host its first ever Virtual International Panel of Experts (VIPOE). The event will bring together global industry and academic experts to share knowledge and support one another around the theme "Exploring the Postpandemic 'New Normal' of TH&E Education and Quality Assurance".



ASHE adapted its working conditions during the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic

In order to ensure the continuity of work during the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the Agency for Science and Higher Education adapted its business activity to new circumstances.

During the quarantine in the Republic of Croatia, from mid-March till mid-May, ASHE adjusted its working hours and organised a special distribution in accordance with of employees the recommendations issued by the competent authorities regarding the protection of employees' health and safety, while also ensuring the continued fulfilment of business obligations.

In compliance with the above said, evaluation procedures in higher education and science, when possible, were carried out online with the professional support of ASHE employees. Online evaluations proved to be a successful response to the exceptional circumstances. Experience gathered through these procedures will be used for the further development and adaptation to the "new normal" working conditions; in fact ASHE plans to carry out online programme accreditations as well as evaluations in science.





CTI Response to COVID-19 Pandemic Situation

The COVID-19 crisis led CTI to adapt the accreditation criteria and its procedures. Among the accreditation criteria, those specifically concerned by the crisis are

- international mobility
- internships and final projects in industry
- apprenticeship tracks

Nonetheless, the HEIs must ensure the achievement of all programme outcomes and follow every student especially when in a fragile situation.

Many CTI procedures have been postponed: HEIs reports, site visits, international procedures, joint CTI-Hcéres evaluations. Plenary sessions have been replaced by virtual sessions. First virtual visits are scheduled in July 2020. Specific guidelines for virtual site visits have been provided. Fortunately, a working group on digitalization for teaching, learning and evaluation started at Fall 2019.

CTI sent several messages of support to HEIs and replied to individual HEIs questions. Dedicated webinars on distance teaching and learning have been organized for HEIs and stakeholders. CTI also regularly edits newsletters and updates its website to make everyone aware of the situation and inform on new procedures.



The work of Nakvis in the COVID-19 pandemic

COVID-19 pandemic resulted in an almost overnight lockdown of all education institutions in Slovenia and in a cancellation of all site visits planned in the accreditation and evaluation procedures.

To continue with the intended work, Nakvis prepared **Guidelines for online site visits** to help HEIs prepare for the new format of work. We successfully performed 13 online site visits in June and July, with generally positive feedback. Based on the evaluation form we've send to the stakeholders we plan to improve the guidelines for the next cycle.

At the same time Nakvis prepared relevant recommendations for better shift to emergency remote education (ERU) as the cancellation of all »face to face« education has accelerated inclusion of online learning significantly.

The main emphasis of the document is on well thought out implementation of ERU, adequate technical support of all users and establishment of mechanisms for ongoing monitoring, adaptation and improvement of teaching and learning. We expect that some of the changes and improvements introduced in teaching and learning during the pandemic situation will remain also in the future..

Update on AHPGS

The AHPGS has successfully completed the procedures for renewal of the EQAR listing (decision 16 March 2020) and membership of ENQA (decision 28 April 2020).

After the "State Treaty on the Organization of a Joint Accreditation System for Quality Assurance in Studies and Teaching at German Universities"



entered into force on January 1, 2018, the AHPGS was the first German agency initiating this procedure which also leads to the approval as an agency in Germany. A special challenge for the AHPGS was the clarification of a common understanding related to ESG 3.4 Thematic Analysis of the Standards and Guidelines for Quality Assurance in the European Higher Education Area. As a consequence, the AHPGS has developed a revised concept for the regular publication of thematic analyses and published first thematic analyses based on it. Furthermore, a critical examination of the ESG standard "Thematic Analyses" in the context of accreditation can be found in the following article. The article is planned as part of a publication in 2020.

Quality Agency for Higher Education (AIKA) Celebrates Its 5th Anniversary

July 1st, 2020, marks 5 years since amendments to the Law came into force delegating the responsibility for quality assurance of higher education in Latvia to the Academic Information Centre (AIC) and its newly established unit - Quality Agency for Higher Education (AIKA).

The objective of this PLA was to identify and design models of good practice to structurally support LRC compliant recognition practices in HEIs. Several examples were presented and discussed. The PLA was structured around two main questions:

AIKA started with a vision to be trustful and internationally recognized, to contribute to continuous quality enhancement of higher education in Latvia and to take an active role in quality assurance processes in the European and global higher education area.

During these years AIKA upheld it's vision by working closely with higher education institutions and other stakeholders in Latvia and by becoming an active member of different international organizations such as ENQA, CEENQA, INQAAHE, ECA.

The Head of AIKA Jolanta Silka shares her view that the last 5 years have been intensive but also rewarding -with the possibility to establish and shape an institution from the very beginning from a written concept to a functional and recognised quality agency that is comparable with its peers in other countries and often looked at as an example of rapid and successful development. It would not be possible without continuous support from stakeholders in Latvia and abroad, shared experience of colleagues from other countries.AIKA is looking forward to future challenges and cooperation with existing and new partners and wishes everyone a warm and sunny summer.
