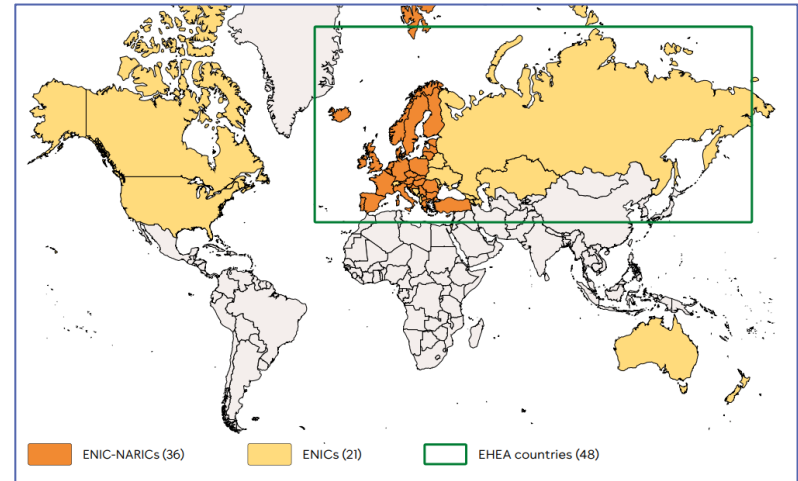
1. Framework “European” recognition practices

- 3 pillars

European Framework

3 pillars

1. Legal: Lisbon Recognition Convention (1997/1999)
2. Operational: ENIC-NARIC Networks
3. Political: EHEA/EEA



2. A Global Recognition Convention

- Context



Context (1)

- Recognition institutionalized after WOI
- Evolving attitudes towards recognition:
 - Changing education systems
 - Increase international student mobility numbers



Context (2)

Legal frameworks reflect changes:

- CoE and UNESCO treaties (50's, 70-'80 ies)
- Newest generation, reversed burden of proof ('90 ies - '10/20-ies)
 - + APNNIC (Asia/Pacific) new network
- NEW: “Global Convention on the recognition of qualifications concerning higher education”
 - Adopted 2019

I-AR. Analysing GRC against LRC

- Leading question “What areas of the GRC require clarification when comparing the treaty to the LRC?”
 - New concepts introduced by the GRC
 - Similar principles that do not require clarification
 - Similar principles that do require clarification
- Findings published in report in October / November 2021
