

Introduction to Seminar

- Recognition of academic + professional qualifications is a cornerstone of international mobility
- Recognition barriers still exist (despite Bologna instruments and LRC)
- Over the past five to ten years new instruments and tools have been developed for better recognition
- These tools are not yet systematically interlinked and used by HEIS and governments


Questions of the seminar


Some statements to vote/comment on (I)

- "We should shift from equivalence of individual diplomas to a more generic recognition " (a bachelor is a bachelor)
- " QA information should be part of all recognition decisions"
- When case to case decisions in recognition of qualifications would have the value of 1 and pure automatic recognition of qualification in the EHEA would have the value of 10; which value would you choose ?

Some statements to vote/comment on (II)

- "Mutual recognition of qualifications, based on earned trust in QA, is a promising concept to simplify the recognition of qualifications"
- "External and/or internal QA processes should check how HEIs tackle recognition of foreign qualifications"
- "Credential evaluators at HEIs need to get professionalized and organized"



Summary and Conclusions of the Seminar (I)

- Recognition is important for promotion of international education and cross-border mobility of students and staff
- Recognition problems still exist but tools and models have been developed to overcome exisiting obstacles
- An evidence and trust based mutual recognition model might presently be the most suitable solution
- Triangle "LO/QF", "QA, "Recognition" should be highlighted and the elements should be interconnected

Summary and Conclusions of the Seminar (II)

- The EAR manual of ENIC/NARICs and the MR Agreements of ECA have the potential to be used in real world; they need support from HEIs and governments
- Close collaboration between HEIs, Recognition bodies, QAAs and governments is needed in order to solve recognition problems
