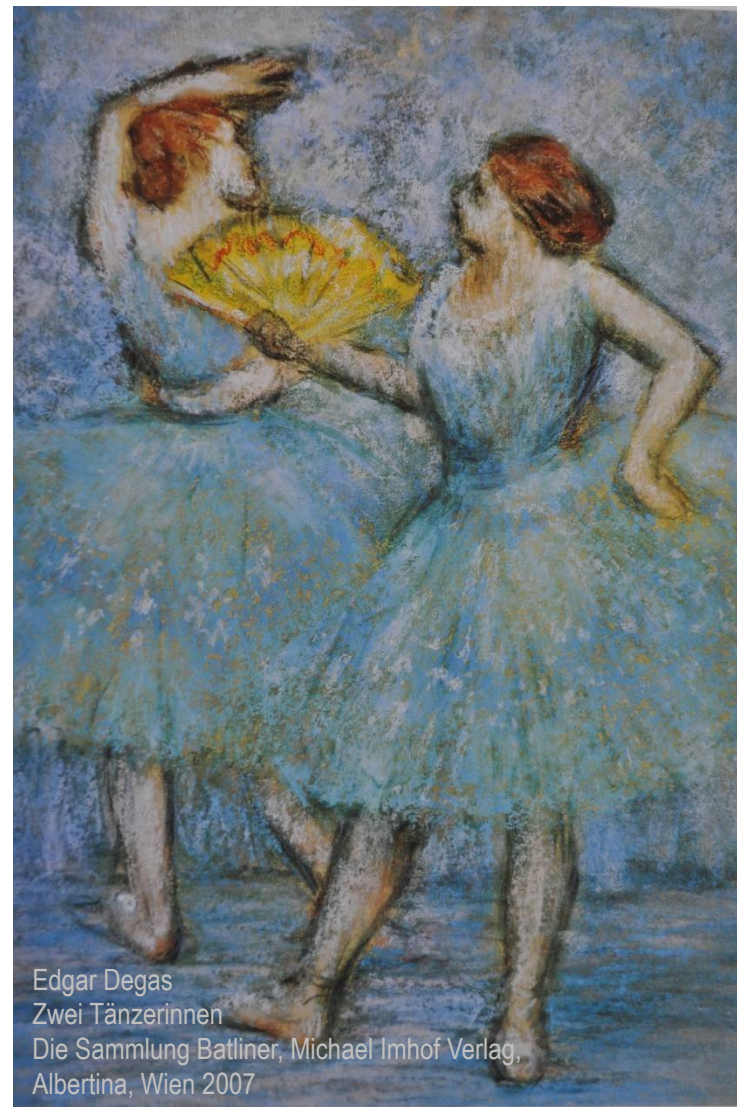

European QA - Achievements

- Quality imperative has pervaded HE systems in Europe
- External QA systems have been established in all countries, various QA networks have been set up
- Internal QA systems at HEI's have been built up, strengthening the institutional leadership role in quality
- Studies show positive impact of QA on educational provisions

European QA - Risks

- Limited connection between QA and recognition tools
- Limited focus on benefit for HE stakeholders/outcomes
- Limited focus on innovation and new developments in HE; QA systems are often trapped in formalism
- Still too many national idiosyncrasies, endangering mutual recognition of qualifications accross borders



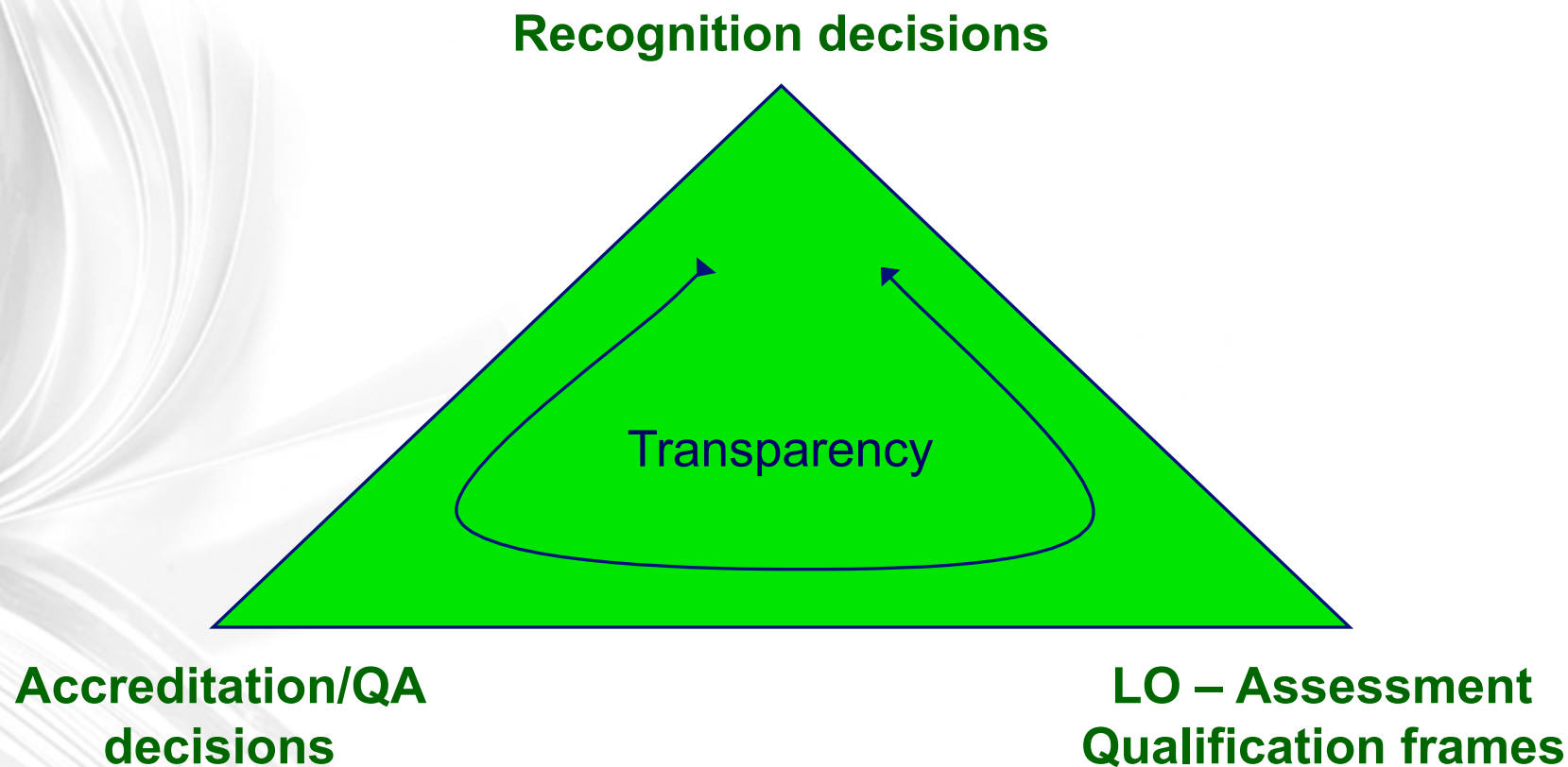
ECA: Foundation and Aim

- Established as a project network in November 2003; turned into an association on April 2014
- Consortium of 16 national accreditation/QA agencies; all regions involved
- Aims: promote mutual recognition of accreditation decisions, enhance transparency in EHEA and support internationalisation of institutions and students

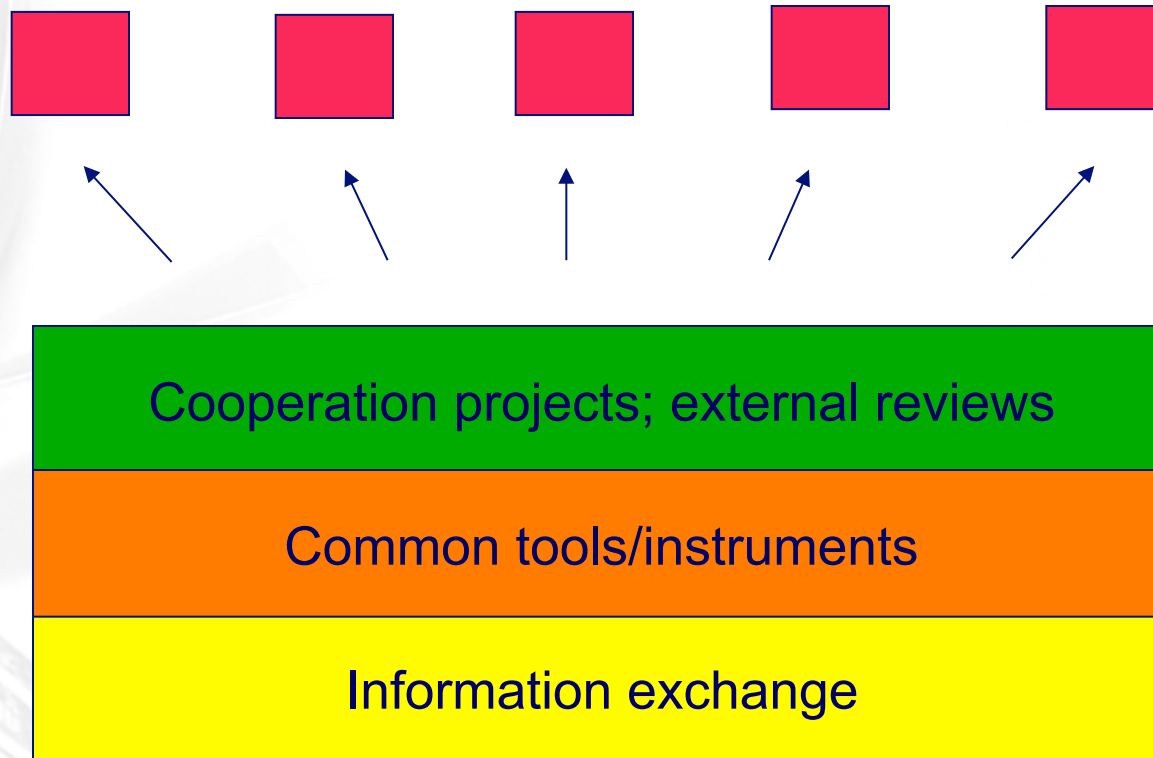


Use of accreditation results for recognition

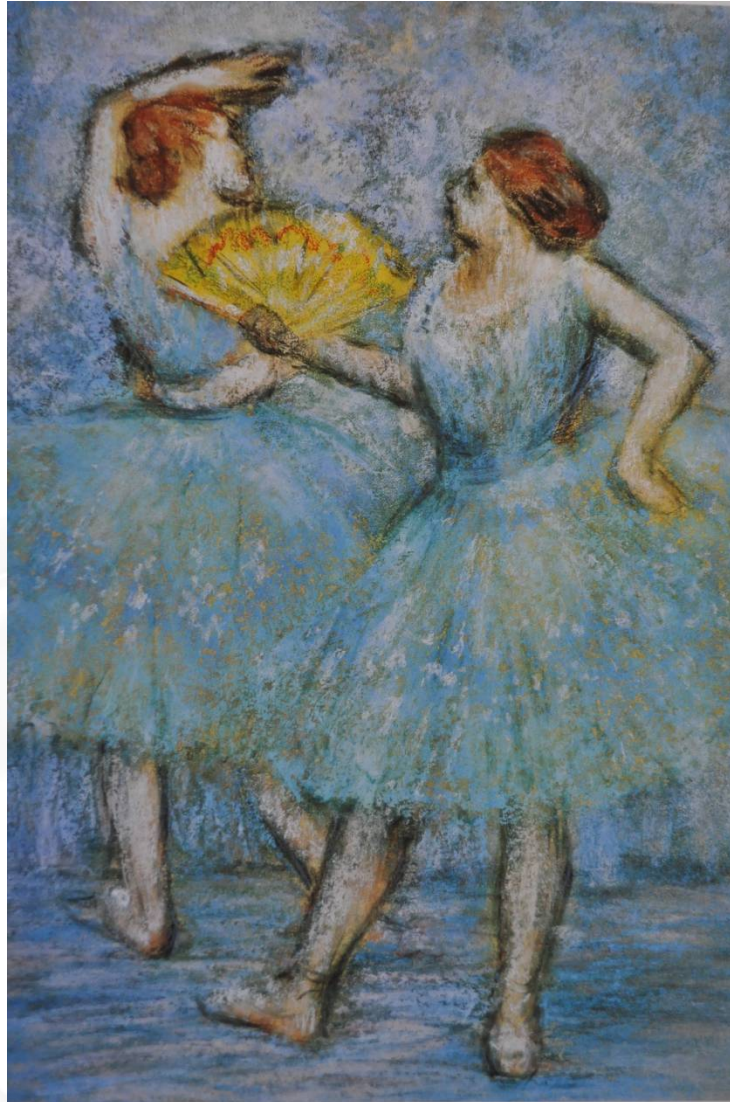

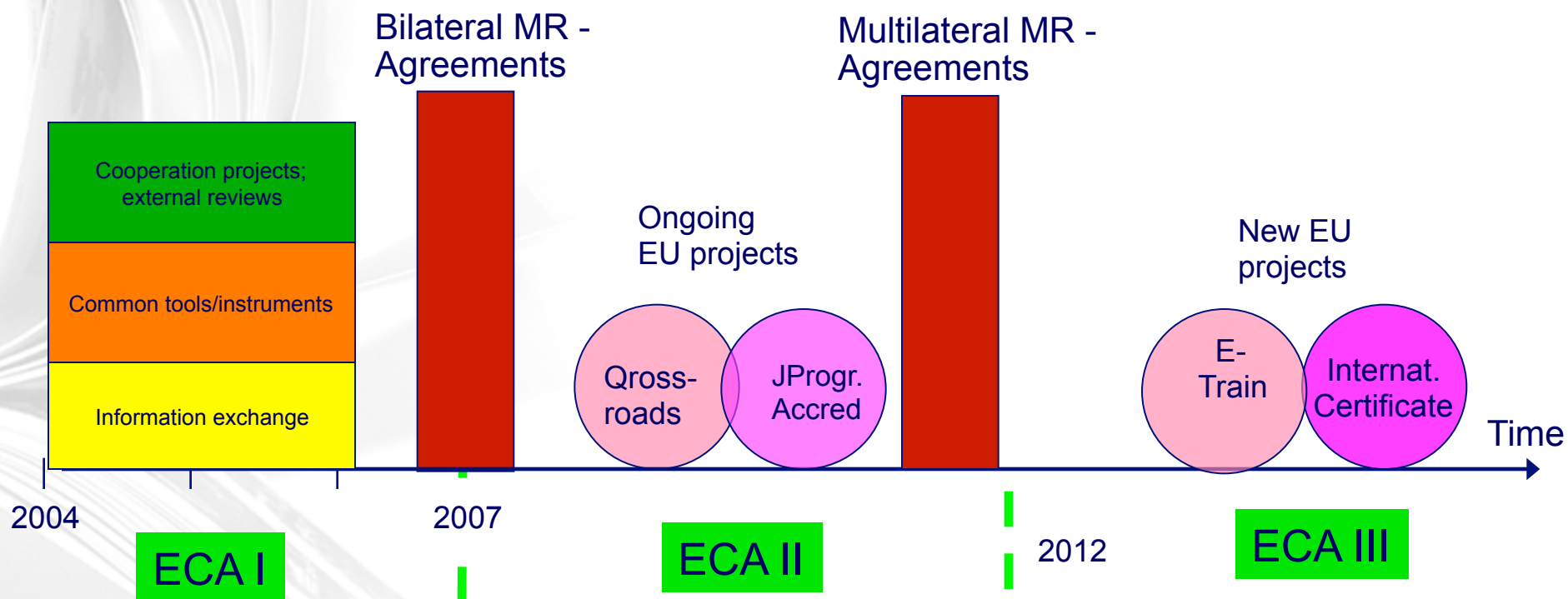

The ECA Project – Three Phases (2003- 2013)

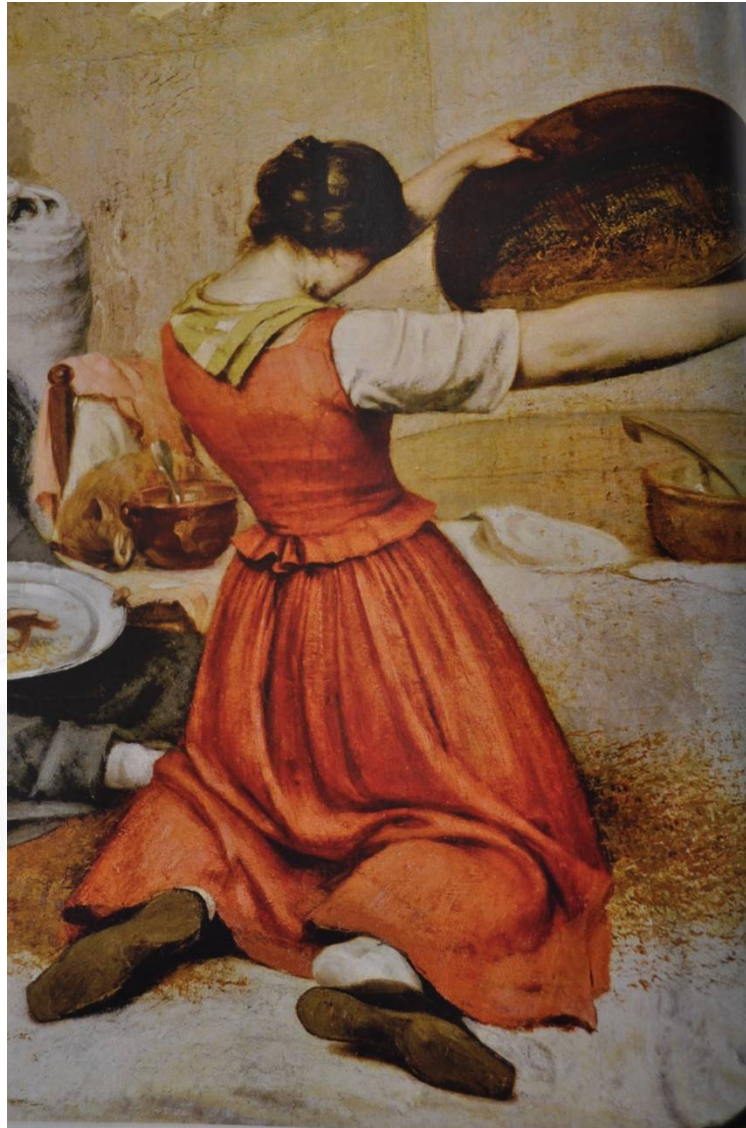

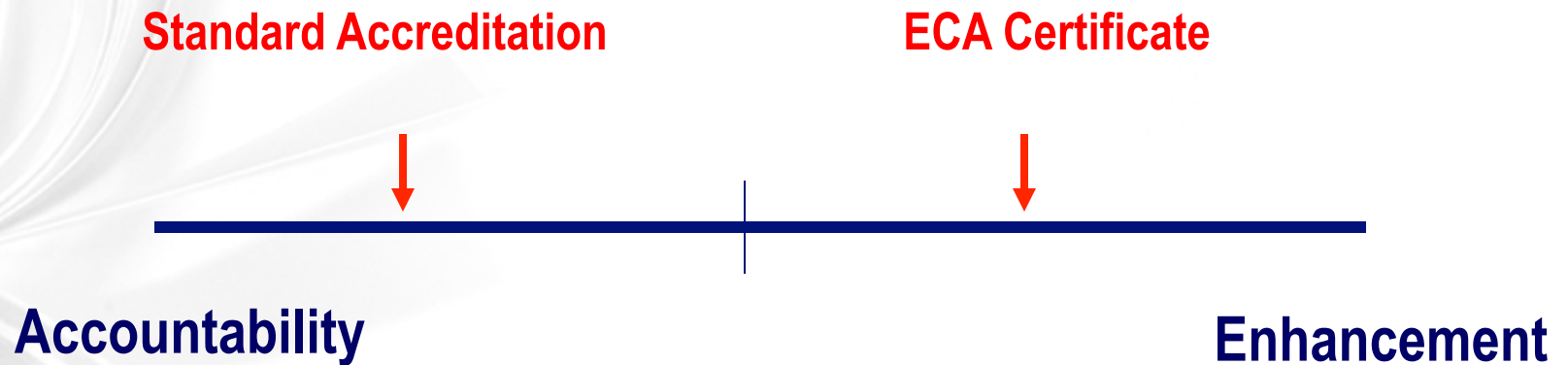

Timetable of CeQuInt project/ECA certificate

2013	Assessment framework, Guidelines for HEIs, Appeals system, Training for experts (CeQuInt)
2014	CeQuInt procedures, supplemented with first procedures on „service basis“
2015	Dissemination of results of CeQuInt project (newsletter, conferences, knowledge base, good practice database, etc.)

Relevance of ECA certificate in Internationalisation

- **For HEI's:** Benchmarking against good practices, brings internationalisation of curriculum to new quality level, attracts new students and staff, opens new funding channels
- **For students/employers:** guarantees that students has achieved high international and intercultural competences; enhances student mobility
- **For society:** increases transparency in internationalisation, promotes European goals
