ABOUT SUCTIA

SUCTIA is a Erasmus + Strategic Partnership project funded for the years 2019-2022.

The aim of the project is also to raise awareness and shift the internal culture of our institutions towards internationalisation, thus creating a systemic change in our institutions and in European Higher Education.

SUCTIA was built in the wake of SUCTI, a three-year initiative (2016-2019) approved for funding under the European Commission's Erasmus+ – KA2 Strategic Partnerships for higher education focusing on the internationalisation of administrative staff. The project was coordinated by the URV, Universitat Rovira i Virgili (Tarragona, Spain). SUCTI showed that systemic change through training sessions for administrative staff is a key to success of the international university and the impact of this change has been measured and assessed.



Shifting a culture is only possible through internationalising all groups of higher education institutions. While many activities exist for internationalising students, and the previous project SUCTI concentrated on the administrative staff, SUCTI Academia is aimed at empowering the third pillar, the academic staff, by providing them with knowledge and skills related to their university's internationalisation process.

Academic staff is expected to internationalise both teaching and research in their academic work, and yet they may not be equipped with the right tools and skills to deliver this properly.

The SUCTIA Conference is the final event of the project in which the achieved goals, expected and unexpected results and its partners' conclusions will be presented.
