Application of a supervised AI algorithm in the assessment of the quality of higher education: results and implications

Núria Mancho-Fora, PhD, Data Analyst at AQU Catalunya

In recent years, AI has had a significant impact on various professional sectors, yet its application in external quality assurance remains largely unexplored. As our institution progresses from program to institutional accreditation, we aimed to investigate the viability of employing AI algorithms to predict at-risk programs. The vast array of indicators available for quality assessment in higher education can be overwhelming, potentially leading to Key Performance Indicator (KPI) overload and hindering organizational progress. This study has allowed us not only to identify at-risk programs but also to reassess our current assessment indicators.
