Bridging QA Agencies with Leading International Experts

At its core, the platform serves as a bridge between quality assurance agencies and highly qualified international experts. By bringing these two groups together in one secure and dedicated environment, the platform will make it easier for agencies to identify, connect with, and engage professionals whose profiles and experience best match their specific needs. This streamlined approach is designed to reduce administrative effort while broadening access to a diverse pool of international expertise.




Strengthening Connections Across the ECA Network

The Expert Exchange Platform will also play a key role in strengthening collaboration within the ECA community. It will provide a structured and transparent way for agencies to submit inquiries for QA experts, fostering stronger partnerships between agencies and experts alike. Through this interconnected approach, the platform aims to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of selecting the right experts for each evaluation or accreditation project.

Expert Recommendations Tailored to Specific Needs


One of the platform's central features is its ability to offer tailored expert recommendations. Based on the criteria defined by individual agencies - such as disciplinary expertise, professional background, or contextual requirements - the platform will suggest the most suitable experts for each assignment. This targeted matching process will help ensure that the right professional is selected every time, supporting high-quality and consistent outcomes in QA procedures.




Sweden's Academic Landscape

ARACIS - 20 years of learning and growing together

To celebrate its 20th anniversary, ARACIS organized four international webinars (May–June 2025) focused on the following key Bologna Process commitments:

In June, ARACIS also held a national seminar in Constanța with QA officers from Romanian higher education institutions and representatives of national authorities, discussing the external QA framework and the development of a quality culture in higher education.

The anniversary year culminated with the International Anniversary Conference (6–7 October, Braşov), featuring high-level representatives from ENQA, EQAR, EUA, OECD, the European Commission, and national stakeholders. The programme addressed themes such as QA for a changing world, the evolving legal framework in Romania, stakeholder engagement, QA for European University Alliances, and future trends in higher education.
